B.L.E.S.S.

How do we share our experience of God's love, grace, and forgiveness without scaring people away or offending them? For most of us, "evangelism" is an intimidating word that suggests handing out tracts to strangers or doing other awkward things. But what if there was a more natural, more authentic way to share your faith with your friends, neighbors, and coworkers?

On Sunday, June 2, we will start a five-week sermon series called **B.L.E.S.S.** which is based on a book of the same name by Dave and Ron Ferguson. Together, we are going to learn how to **B.L.E.S.S.** our community in response to God's call to love our neighbors. It includes five practices that help us introduce people to Jesus. We are to:

Begin with prayer

Listen with care

Eat together (my personal favorite)

Serve in love

Share our stories

We already participate in one or more of these practices every day with our family and friends. When we direct the practices towards people who may be far from God, or those who have never been in or have left the church, it becomes much less intimidating to share the message of God's grace and love. Not only will we bless people we will comfortably open the door for them to experience new life in Christ.

This Sunday the sermon series begins with a focus on prayer. We will consider what it means to ask God how he wants us to bless people in the everyday places he sends us. If you haven't already started, please pray for this sermon series as we learn together about the different and engaging ways we can bless our neighbors when we apply the five practices of **B.L.E.S.S.** to our lives.

I also ask that you pray for the South Georgia Annual Conference as it convenes in Tifton on Sunday afternoon. The conference runs through Tuesday, June 4. Live streaming of the worship services and all business sessions will be available at sgaumc.org. Your delegates to the Annual Conference are Tom Jones, Richard Soper, Lawrence Bridges, Becky Bridges, and Celia Eisentraeger. Kevin Lamb is on the conference worship committee and will be using his talents to assist in the worship services.

The Way Forward FAQ

What role does the Church Council play in determining whether we stay connected with or leave the United Methodist Church?

The Church Council is comprised of members of the church who are elected by the Charge Conference to represent the church in its administration, vision, and ministries. In matters related to The Way Forward, the Church Council is empowered to determine whether our church should remain with the UMC or if a Church Conference should be convened for the purpose of voting on departure. This decision will be made at a called Church Council Meeting on Monday, July 8, at 6:00pm. While the Church Council can vote to remain with the UMC, it cannot vote to depart the UMC because departure includes matters related to the transfer of property which can only be approved by a Church Conference. A Church Conference is open to all members and is presided over by the District Superintendent or an Ordained Elder of his choosing. Only members present at a Church Conference can vote on any matters before the conference. There is no proxy voting. Please note that the Church Council Meeting on Monday, June 10, will be its regularly scheduled meeting; no action on whether to stay connected to the UMC or to have a Church Conference will take place at this meeting. All Church Council Meetings are open meetings. Guests attending the meetings have voice, at the discretion of the Church Council Chair, but no vote.

Listening Sessions and Informational Meeting – The Way Forward

There will be several opportunities for you during the month of June to learn more about the Way Forward for our church and for you to take part in the discernment process. On Tuesday, June 18, at 6:00pm and Thursday, June 20, at 11:00am, our lay and clergy leadership will host Listening Sessions. We look forward to hearing from you during these sessions. You will also learn more about the effect the outcomes of General Conference may or may not have on our church. Both sessions will be held in the Sanctuary.

Our District Superintendent, Rev. Dr. Scott Hagan, will join us on Wednesday, June 26, 6:00pm, in the Sanctuary, for an informational meeting. He will provide us with reasons for us to stay connected with the UMC as well as details pertaining to the voting process and departure from the UMC, depending on which direction our church chooses. He will also answer questions that have been submitted in writing. You may submit your questions by sending them to <code>anne@stsimonsumc.com</code> or by completing a form at the meeting that evening on June 26. Questions that are similar will be combined into a single question.

Please mark your calendars and plan to attend. Also, continue to pray for God's wisdom and direction in your life and in the life of our church.
