

2025 - A Year in the Bible Together

I recently received an article from the New York Times. It pointed out that the sales of Bibles are booming, fueled by first time buyers. One 28-year-old woman said, "I've had Bibles that my mom gave me, but I felt I needed my own to start to my own journey. Something was missing. It's a combination of where we are in the world, general anxiety and the sense that meaning and comfort can be found in the Bible." The overriding theme of the article was that people are looking for hope and the Bible is what they are reaching for.

The article tugged at my heart. I felt a renewed challenge to lead our congregation into a year of exploring the epic story of the Bible and how it relates to us today. In turn, I want to challenge you to join with members of our congregation in reading and studying the Bible together in 2025.

The first step is to purchase the <u>One Year Chronological Study</u> <u>Bible – New Living Translation</u>. This Bible is published by Tyndale House and can be easily found on Amazon and at other book vendors. Reading the Bible in chronological order will help you better understand God's redemptive plan as you move through the scriptures from creation to Revelation in the order the events occurred or when passages, like Paul's letters, were written.

In the coming year, my plan is to preach sermons based on a story or spiritual truth we have read in the previous week's daily readings. I want to encourage existing Sunday School classes to consider this format for all or for a portion of your classes during the year. I also pray that individuals will step-up who are led to form and facilitate new study groups. These groups will focus on the weekly readings and serve as a means of holding one another accountable in our reading. If you feel called to serve in this way, please let me know and we will make it happen.

This Sunday we continue our journey to Bethlehem. As we move closer to Christmas it's my prayer that you will gift yourself, and possibly someone you care about, with a One Year Chronological Study Bible. In doing so it will serve as the starting point for yet another journey - our personal and churchwide journey through the Bible together in 2025!
