

How Will You Respond?

RSVP originates from the French phrase "Répondez s'il vous plaît," which translates, "Please respond." While some of us are diligent in our efforts to RSVP to any invitation we receive, others choose to wait until the last minute to respond. We may hold off on our response because of the uncertainty of our schedules. In some instances, we don't want to commit too quickly because a better offer may come along. Then there are those who choose not to RSVP – they simply don't respond.

The same can often be said as it relates to our faith journeys. Jesus' invitation includes the words, "Follow me." There of those of us who find reasons why we should delay our response. Others of us choose to ignore the invitation. We miss out on the blessings and the opportunities that God provides when we accept his invitation – an invitation that is always open.

Many of us know the parable of the prodigal son found in Luke 15. The son made the choice to walk away from his father and leave home. He thought he could take care of himself, and he wanted to be on his own. When things didn't work out so well, he decided to return home, uncertain if his father would even let him in the house. But not only did the father welcome his son home, he ran to meet him.

In the story of Jonah, he chooses to ignore God's invitation and tried to run from God. Jonah's story serves to remind us of the persistence of God's invitation and of how he extends his invitation to all people – even to the people of Ninevah who were enemies of God and of God's people.

Have you accepted God's invitation to follow him and serve him faithfully? He is waiting for your RSVP. How will you respond? Blessings,
