

The First Step

The first step. Sometimes it is not an easy thing to do. Uncertainty, fear, or simply procrastination can make it difficult.

I remember many "first steps." A few that stand out include the first step I took off of a cliff to rappel down a mountain side. There was the first step up the ladder to the high dive. Then there was the first step towards fulltime ministry. None of these were easy decisions to make, but I have learned over the years, as most of us have, that we are never going to get anywhere unless we overcome whatever it is that is holding us back and take the first step.

This is certainly true when it comes to forgiveness. Most of us know someone we need to forgive or someone we need to ask to forgive us. But we can be stubborn, can't we? In doing so we remain stuck where we are with no hope of new beginnings. We convince ourselves that it's the other person who has to make the first move. Usually, the end result is that there's no forgiveness, no reconciliation, and the wounds created by a harmful word or action fail to heal.

In the sermon this Sunday we will consider the story of one of Jacob's sons, Joseph. There are several overriding themes regarding family, faithfulness, and forgiveness that weave in and out of his story. We learn that he was sold into slavery by his brothers; that he trusted God to care for him in the years before he was appointed to a position of power in Egypt; and that by being in this position he is given the opportunity to meet with his brothers.

When his brothers recognize Joseph they are afraid of what may happen. They know that payback is due them. Joseph could certainly make life hard for them; he could even order that their lives be taken if he chose to do so. But instead of payback or punishment, Joseph took the first step towards offering forgiveness. By taking this step, the brothers and the family were reconciled.

Has someone hurt you? Has someone made you angry? Has someone made the choice to create a greater distance in a relationship? In 2 Corinthians 5:18 we read that reconciliation is from God, "who reconciled us to himself through Christ, and has given us the ministry of reconciliation." Take the first step. Blessings,
