Who?

In our journey through the Bible, we are now in the book Exodus. It is a book full of rich and wonderful stories describing how the Israelites were freed from slavery in Egypt followed by their trials in the wilderness and how their faith in God fluctuated between hot and cold.

One of the more familiar stories is the call of Moses. Who can forget from our days in Sunday School the story of the burning bush that didn't burn up and how God spoke to Moses in that moment? It's a story that makes an immediate impression and is difficult to forget. But beyond the booming voice of God, at least that's the way it was in the movies, and the dramatic use of fire there is so much more to this story. It's a story we can call, "Who?" The word "who" figures prominently in the story because it seems to be the only thing Moses can say. Scholars think Moses may have had a stutter. In this case, he seems to be stuttering over the word "who." Who am I that you should pick me? Who are you, by the way? Who will believe me? No one, that's who! Who will listen to anything I have to say? Who else could you send to do this?

There are those of us who are unsure of how to handle the idea that God has called us. We hear the word "call," and we think of a call to ordained ministry or some higher calling. But as a follower of Christ, it is important to remember that your call is to full-time ministry. When you stop asking "Who?" and accept that God is calling you, you will begin to approach all you do and each interaction with others as opportunities for ministry. You will be surprised in doing so how ordinary, everyday places can become holy ground. Did you find all **16 books** of the Bible in last week's brain teaser? If

Maybe it is just a (1) <u>fluke</u>, but there are sixteen books of the Bible included in these (2) re<u>marks</u>. For some it will keep them (3) looking so hard for the (4) facts. For others, each sentence will include a (5) <u>revelation</u>. Some found themselves in a (6) <u>jam, especially</u> since the names of the books were not capitalized, but the (7) t<u>ruth</u> finally struck home to (8) <u>numbers</u> of readers. To others it was a real (9) <u>job</u>. My hope was to make this (10) <u>a most</u> enjoyable exercise. (11) <u>Yes, there</u> will be some easy ones to spot. Others may require (12) <u>judges</u> to help them. I will quickly (13) admit it usually takes a Bible scholar to find one of them, and there may be loud (14) <u>lamentations</u> when it is found. One person said (15) <u>she brews</u> a cup of tea so she can concentrate better. See how well you can (16) compete. Relax and enjoy the experience. There really are sixteen names of books in the Bible in this statement.

To be in God's Word is a vital part of living into God's call for your life. Keep reading!




