

Holy Living

It became one of the most lucrative used-car deals in history. It happened in 2005. A 21-year-old German man sold his 1999 Volkswagen Golf with 47,000 miles on it. He had paid just over \$10,000 for the car. He sold it on eBay for a quarter of a million — to an American, who traveled all the way to Germany to claim it.

Why would anybody pay a guarter of a million dollars for a used Volkswagen Golf, parked halfway around the world? The car itself was nothing special. It had everything to do with the papers that went along with it. The young man who decided to sell the car realized, as he did a title search, that the former owner had just left Germany to take a new job: in the Vatican. That humble Volkswagen Golf had belonged to one Josef Kardinal Ratzinger, who became Pope Benedict XVI.

Was it celebrity status that drove the price up so high? People will pay all kinds of crazy prices for Elvis' rhinestone belt or Marilyn Monroe's dress. Or was it something different - something to do, perhaps, with a perception that this car was somehow holy by association?

There are places, people, and things we value based on our perception of their being holy. Most of us have considered the question, "I wonder how I am perceived by other people?" I know from firsthand experience that much of what teenage girls have on their minds is what others think about them. But have you ever gone as far as to think if others, when they see you or your name comes to mind, perceive you as a holy person?

Our living a holy life may not lead to a profitable sale of merchandise. But what it does lead us into is a deeper relationship with God so that others will see his glory in us. Hebrews 12:14 challenges us with these words: "Work at living in peace with everyone, and work at living a holy life."

Some of you have said to me in recent days how difficult it has been to read Leviticus. I am right there with you; to the point that I have often wondered, "Why Leviticus?!" As we gather this Sunday my prayer is that we will be able to learn how even Leviticus can guide us to a better understanding of what it means for us to be holy. Blessings,

Leviticus 27:31-32 - You must faithfully keep all my commands by putting them into practice, for I am the Lord. I am the Lord who makes you holy.


