Ephphatha

Mark gives the meaning of this word: "be opened." Jesus spoke this word when he healed a deaf man who also had a speech impediment. The impediment might as well have been a result of his inability to hear. Jesus commands the ears of a deaf man to be opened ("Ephphatha") so that he can hear. After this healing the people acclaim, "He has done all things well. He makes the deaf hear and the mute speak."

We find that as Jesus opened himself to the power of the Holy Spirit, he found a quiet place for healing. So many times, in the classroom teachers must find quietness and calmness before they can become open minded. A child must feel safe and calm to accept the seed that is about to be planted.

Our heart... "Ephphatha".

Being open minded allows our hearts to be open to change, differences, and to growth. Being open to the possibility that there is hope in the world, and it might not look like you think it would. We may refuse to listen to someone because we presume, they are saying the same old thing. There is a seed that needs to be planted, that may not grow the way your lesson plan was written.

Our ears..."Ephphatha".

We found that Jesus walked away from the crowd to heal this deaf man. He didn't need a pat on the back or an award to do the right thing. I believe he didn't have his disciples keeping score. Being open minded allows us to make room for everyone's creativity. Sometimes we are blinded by what we assume. Our unseen work ... "Ephphatha".

Teaching is a ministry that is based on faith. Education is truly the substance of things that we hope for in the future. The evidence of things not seen calls our spirits to be open. A child's imagination is the purest form of Ephphatha.
